ADMIN NOW AT POLICE STATION



The Arlington City Council Employee Relations Committee met several times throughout 2015, to discuss ways the City's Administration Staff could better meet the needs of Arlington Residents. Throughout the first part of this year, the City of Arlington Administration Staff has done a little reorganizing. There are now three full-time Administration personnel on staff, as the City Council has moved to hire Annie Shottliff for full-time employment as Community Center Coordinator/ Office Assistant. Her duties will continue to include maintaining all aspects of the Community Center along with various Administrative Assistant duties. What most residents don't know is she is in charge of fire and ambulance billing, maintaining all aspects of the City's internet correspondence (website, e-newsletters, and social media accounts), writing the City's newsletter and assisting residents with their various needs at the front counter. Her new duties will include facilitating the building permit process, assisting Deputy Clerk Lisa Tesch by taking some of the work load off of her, including payroll and accounts payable, and representing the City on various committees (Farmer's Market, Arli-Dazzle, Leading Sibley, etc.).

It had repeatedly been brought to City Staff's attention, that residents have a difficult time reaching the Police Department when in need, so with that in mind, Administrative Assistant Vicki Pomplun is now a full-time admin staff member located in the Arlington Police Station. She will be there to assist in answering phone calls, assisting with police administration duties and being a liaison between the public and the Police Department. She will also continue with several of her admin duties including meeting minutes and managing elections, along with other varying administrative duties for the City Office. Please feel free to stop in or call the Police Department, Monday through Friday from 8am-5pm, with any questions or concerns.

A Beautiful City Growing in Unity

1. You will need a building and/or land use permit from the City Office before starting your project. Processing time is normally one to two weeks, so please schedule accordingly.
2. Fences must have finished sides facing outward, this means you look at the posts when you are inside the fence.
3. Fences must have posts buried at least 30" deep and encased in cement.
4. Fences can be located in side or rear yards, but fencing is not allowed in front yards.
5. Fences can be no more than six feet in height and must be of conventional fencing material. No agricultural fencing is allowed.
6. You are responsible for finding and marking your own property lines. You may check out a metal detector from the City Shop or contact a surveyor to locate your property pins.
7. You are responsible for keeping accessory structures out of the easements.
8. Sheds and detached garages need to 'blend in' with your house in terms of size, shape and color.
9. Canvas covered sheds, car ports, and 'hoop shed' designs are not allowed.
10. Sheds and detached garages are subject to setback, height, and size standards.
