THREE FILE FOR TWO OPEN COUNCIL SEATS

The filing period for City Council closed August 14th, with three candidates filing for Arlington's two open City Council seats. Incumbent Councilmembers Michelle 'Shelly' Battcher and Jim Heiland, as well as past City Councilmember Jennifer Nuesse, will vie for the two open seats. Current Arlington Mayor Richard Nagel was the only one to file for Mayor. Voters will decide their Councilmembers & Mayor at the November 6th General Election.

The classes are generally held two nights a week with the course completion date set for early February. The City of Arlington will pay your tuition for the course, provided that you pass the class and become an active member, in good standing, of the Arlington Area Ambulance Service for a minimum of one year.

TREE PLANTING EVENT- VOLUNTEERS NEEDED



DRAGONFLY NOTES: ON DISTANCE & LOSS



Anne Panning is the daughter of the late Lowell & Barb Panning. She grew up in Arlington and graduated from Arlington Green Isle School in 1984. Anne's new book "Dragonfly Notes: On Distance and Loss" will hit shelves on September 18th with a special release with Northern Virginia's annual 2018 Fall for the Book festival. Panning's first memoir draws on decades of memory and experience from her childhood home in rural Minnesota to the riverbanks of Vietnam's Mekong Delta, as she pieces together the hard truths about her own and her mother's pasts. A stark, poignant tale of two women deeply connected, yet somehow forever apart.



This memoir is a testament to the prevailing nature of love, whether in the form of a rediscovered note, a sudden moment of unexpected recall, or sometimes, simply the sight of a dragonfly flitting past. Originally from Minnesota, Panning now lives in upstate New York with her husband and two children.

HYDRANT FLUSHING TO TAKE PLACE

DRIVER'S SAFETY CLASS

Senior Driver Improvement Classes are for those individuals looking to renew and improve their driving skills and/or qualify for a discount on their auto insurance premium (according to Minnesota law) if you are 55 and older. If you have already taken the initial class, a renewal class is needed every three years. Classes have been scheduled at the Arlington Community Center this fall. The four hour refresher class is being offered on Monday, October 29th, and the initial eight hour class will be split into two evenings on Wednesday and Thursday, November 28th and 29th.
