APPLIANCE REBATES 2020

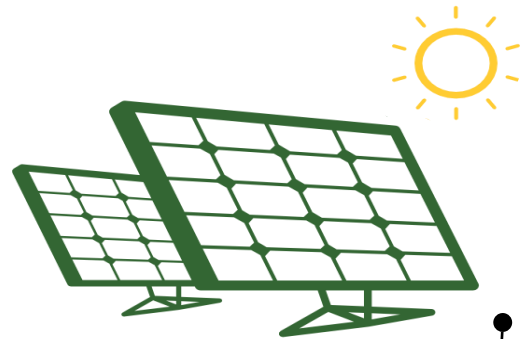
You can earn money back when replacing your old appliances with new, energy efficient models. These models must be ENERGY STAR Certified in order to qualify for the rebate.

How do I know if an appliance is ENERGY STAR Certified?

Look for the ENERGY STAR logo on the yellow energy guide included with new appliances.

Pet licenses expire on March 31.

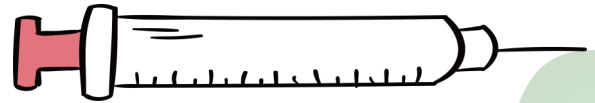

Refrigerator	\$25.00
Freezer	\$25.00
Dishwasher	\$25.00
Clothes Washer	\$25.00
Dehumidifier	\$25.00
Recycling Bonus for Refrigerator or Freezer	\$50.00

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE ENERGY STAR CERTIFIED?

- ENERGY STAR certified freezers are 10% more efficient than new, standard models.
- ENERGY STAR certified dishwashers are 12% more energy efficient and 30% more water efficient than new, standard models.
- ENERGY STAR certified clothes washers use 25% less energy and 33% less water than new, standard models.
- ENERGY STAR certified dehumidifiers use 30% less energy than new, standard models.
- ENERGY STAR certified refrigerators are 9% more efficient than new, standard models and 50% more efficient than older models.
