## PET LICENSES ARE DUE



Though this year has been anything but routine, please don't forget to renew your pet's registration with the City. *All dogs and cats are required to be registered with the City.* Should your pet get away from you, this will help us return them safely home. While the Shelter-in-Place order is in effect, please place a copy of your pet's rabies vaccination certificate along with \$5 per pet in an envelope labeled with your first and last name, street address, and phone number. Leave this in the payment drop-box outside the City Office. Your information will be recorded, a tag number assigned, and a receipt made. These items will be stored in your labeled envelope, and once we're open again, we'll give you a call to pick them up.

90°

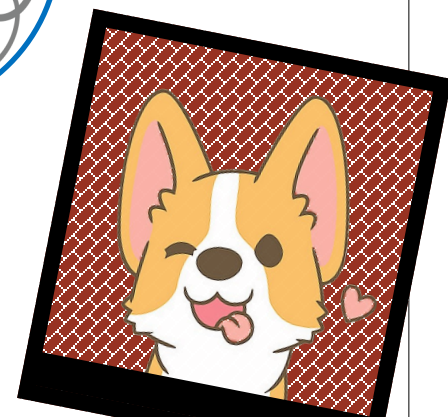
Even if the temperature outside is only 70°, the inside of your car may be as much as 20 degrees hotter!

120°

Within just 30 minutes, the car's interior can climb from 85° to a scorching 120°.
