CITY ASKS FOR HELP WHEN PLACING GARBAGE CANS FOR PICKUP

October is a busy month for street maintenance, in particular, the sweeping up of leaves. Because of this, City Staff would like to encourage residents not to place their garbage cans in the street. Garbage cans collected at the street, should, if at all possible, be placed in your driveway or within the boulevard area. This assists the City in street sweeping, snow plowing, and other maintenance efforts. Thank you for your cooperation in this effort!

NO BURNING OF FALL LEAVES

With the fall season upon us, ideas for getting rid of leaves begin to surface. Residents should remember that burning leaves within city limits is prohibited. Fires are only permitted within city limits as long as they are for recreational purposes. *Recreational purposes* shall include only the cooking of food or providing heat and light for outdoor social gatherings. Only propane, charcoal bricks, or wood products may be used to fuel outdoor fires and shall be contained in an outdoor fire place, barbecue equipment, or a concrete-lined fire pit, sufficient to provide physical limitation to the spread of the fire.



COMPOST SITE IS STILL OPEN

Want to get rid of those fall leaves? The City's compost site is open 7 days a week for residents in city limits. The site is located near the wastewater treatment plant on Freedom Drive (SE corner of town). *Allowable Compost:* lawn clippings, garden compost, and leaves (no plastic bags). **No garbage or construction material is allowed at the compost site.** *Small brush pile:* No stumps or logs. For larger quantities of brush, the City will do chipping on location, for a cost. Call the City Office to get the cost and to schedule for the chipping service.

PLANNED POWER OUTAGE

There will be two brief electrical outages the week of September 30th, to do some maintenance at the substation. The planned dates for this are **Monday, September 30 AND Friday, October 4, 2019.** These are planned to be short power outages, between 8:00 a.m. & 9:00 a.m. both days, necessary only to do the required maintenance. Please mark this on your calendars and plan accordingly for those mornings.



MED DISPOSAL BOX

A medication disposal box is now located in the entrance of the Arlington Police Dept. at 108 4th Ave NW. It is available 24 hours/day, 7 days/week and is under camera surveillance at all times. Acceptable items: prescription, OTC, and pet medications in the form of pills, liquids or lotions. *Non-acceptable items: IV bags, liquid chemotherapy drugs, medical equipment, and Schedule I controlled substances.*

ADDITIONALLY there is now also a "sharps container" for empty, used syringes/needles. These may only be dropped off when Police personnel are present, generally during business hours - Mon. thru Fri. 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Instructions are posted at the PD main entrance. All items must be in a safe container, with no needles exposed.

This year's Fire Prevention Week will be held from October 6th-12th. Fire Prevention Week is a good reminder to everyone to check and replace the batteries in their smoke detectors. Smoke alarms that are properly installed and maintained play a vital role in reducing fire injuries and deaths. On Tuesday, October 8th, the Arlington Fire Dept. will join the Gaylord Fire Dept. for a joint fire safety presentation with the students at the Sibley East Elementary School in Gaylord. Wednesday, October 9th, the AFD will be delivering takeout orders from local businesses from 5:00-7:00 p.m. Participating businesses include the Arlington Haus, Cenex, and Godfather's. When they deliver your order to your home, they will also change the batteries in your smoke detectors, with a limit of two per household.

CITY PAYMENT OPTIONS



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City Office Staff would like to remind residents that the City offers several different options when it comes to paying your city bill. Online— Residents can pay their city bill on the City's website, using their credit/debit card (2.5% convenience fee) or by electronic check (\$1.50 flat fee).

Automatic payment— The City offers automatic withdrawal from your checking or savings account (no additional fee). Automatic payments are set up to take place on the 4th day of every month.

Over the phone— City Staff will take a payment over the phone by using your credit/debit card (2.5% convenience fee) or by electronic check (\$1.50 flat fee).

Drop-Off— Payments can be made in person at the City Office, or dropped off in the payment box located in the parking lot (any time of day) next to the City's mailbox. There is also a payment box inside the Arlington State Bank during their business hours.
