ADMINISTRATOR EXCEPTION

Simplifying the Zoning Variance Process

The City Council with the help of the Planning and Zoning Committee passed legislation that will help streamline the variance process in Arlington. This process will be officially called the Administrator Exception Policy.


This policy will allow certain accessory structures to avoid the public hearing process. For the accessory structure to qualify, the structure must be a permitted feature and follow certain standards. The purpose of the standards is to make sure the proposed accessory structure is not harmful to the use and enjoyment of the neighbors in the direct vicinity, while at the same time making sure that the established structure is not harmful to public health, safety, morals, and comfort of the public.

This is the first step in many to help streamline the variance process. The main goal is to cut down on the red tape and to simplify the process for local residents.
