COMMUNITY CLEANUP DAY

The City of Arlington Community Cleanup Day is set for **Thursday, June 24th, from 9 a.m to 4 p.m** at the Sibley County Fairgrounds. This special recycling event is for anyone from the tri-county area, however the City of Arlington will be providing dumpsters for large trash items (no household or kitchen trash) free of charge. These dumpsters will be available only to residents of the City of Arlington, and you may be asked to provide proof that you live within City limits.

Tri-County Solid Waste, will be accepting a variety of recyclables and waste items, some limitations apply.

Appliances: Must be empty. Washers, dryers, hot water heaters, stoves, furnaces, microwaves, dehumidifiers, refrigerators, freezers, & air conditioners—\$10.00

Car/ light truck tires—\$2.00 each

Semi/ small implement—\$5.00 each

Large Implement—\$10.00 each

*Charges are Double for Tires on Rims.

Electronics accepted: TV, computer equipment, VCR/CD/DVD, stereo, copier, cell phone, boom-box, fax machine, etc.

TV's and computer screens - any size—\$10.00

Hard drives, VCRs, stereos, misc.—\$5.00

Couch, Lay-Z-Boy, Kitchen table, Grill, misc.—\$10.00

Mattress, Box Springs-\$15.00 *will not be accepted if wet or deemed infested

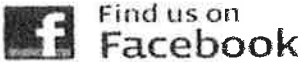

**EDA Offers Revolving Loan Fund to
help local businesses**

The Arlington Economic Development Authority Revolving Loan Program is a flexible source of loan funds to provide gap financing to “for profit” businesses on relocation/expansion projects that encourage the creation of quality jobs and increase new property tax opportunities within the City of Arlington.



Eligible activities for assistance include:

- Equipment and machinery
- Furniture and fixtures
- Land and building acquisitions
- New building construction or building renovation/rehabilitation
- Building expansion and/or construction of site improvements
- Working capital
- Inventory

Ineligible use of proceeds:

- Loans may not be used to service or refinance any existing debt.
- Not-for-profit businesses are not eligible
- Personal property items
- Previously completed or started projects

A Friendly Reminder

Please do not dispose of grass clippings in the street. This causes clogged catch basins. If you have a catch basin near your home, please keep it clear to ensure proper storm drainage.

Replace old water softeners

Help keep the costs of water softening down for yourself and the City. If you still have a time-clock water softener, it's time to replace it with the new, demand-initiated type. This type significantly reduces salt use and can save time and money. The City of Arlington will waive the cost of the building permit (\$51.00) if you upgrade your old water softener to a new demand-initiated softener.
