MED DISPOSAL BOX

(POLICE DEPARTMENT ENTRANCE) (108 4th AVE. NW)



Al Christensen of Tri-County Solid Waste assisted the Police Department in obtaining a Hazardous Waste Grant through the MN Pollution Control Agency. The med disposal box was donated to the Police Department under that grant.

The med disposal box is intended to provide residents with a safe and proper place to dispose of various household and/or pet medications. Items can be dropped off 24/7 (preferably in their original containers); no need to remove labels. Absolutely


NO NEEDLES/SYRINGES are permitted in the med disposal box.

All items will be taken to an incinerating facility for proper disposal.

SHARPS CONTAINER

(POLICE DEPARTMENT INTERIOR OFFICE)

Tri-County Solid Waste has provided a separate container to the Police Department for the proper disposal of new/used empty needles/syringes. The sharps container is located within the interior office of the Police Department.



Needles/Syringes <u>MUST</u> be in some type of a sealed container (ex. plastic bottle with cap). <u>NO</u> loose needles/syringes will be accepted.

NO needle/syringe containers are to be left in the Police Department Entrance or put into the med disposal box. Residents are asked to bring their items when an Officer/PD Staff are at the Office (primarily daytime/weekday hours) to be placed in the sharps container directly.
